TALL SHIPS REGATTA 2014

This will start from Falmouth on the 31st of August next year and one of the boats taking part will have a crew comprised mainly of St Mawes SC members. The boat in question is an Ocean 62 schooner called *Merrilyn* which belongs to the Rona Sailing Project (RSP). There should be sixteen people on board which will include six members of 'the afterguard', all of whom have experience of sailing with the RSP, and it is hoped that the other ten will all be members of the club. At the moment eight have signed up for it (all of whom will be between 16-ish and 19-ish) so there are still a couple of places left. Nigel Sharp will be the skipper – not because he is the Commodore of StMSC but because he is an established skipper with the RSP, but the fact that he is also Commodore is a happy coincidence! The race itself is from Falmouth to the Isle of Wight, and *Merrilyn* will then cruise to the official finish at Greenwich, stopping on the way as time and weather permit.
