Cruiser Class Handicap Update

Following the new 'A' Class Handicap System details we gave you in the January Newsletter there's a further modification that Cruiser Class racers need to be aware of for 2015. It could mean that if you have previously raced under the 'A' class flag you might need to go shopping! During the next Summer Thursday Series the 'A' class will race under an 'E' flag for the faster boats or a 'U' flag for the slower ones. The pros and cons of splitting the 'A' class for racing purposes have been discussed at length and opinion is divided, so for 2015 there will be a trial on Summer Thursdays. The plan is for 'E' and 'U' classed cruisers to start at the same time but the Race Officer has the option to set a shorter race for the slower 'U' flagged boats. The faster 'E' flagged cruiser class craft will have the opportunity to do longer courses. "We

hope this compromise during 2015 will provide data and valuable feedback for 2016," said Sailing

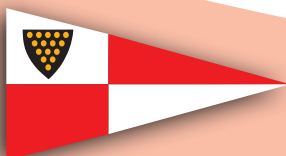
