**Moorings** – Some special advice following a recent detachment. It appears that the thimble for the strop was attached to the riser just below the buoy and not on a chain pennant as is usual, so the rope around the thimble chafed against the chain, no doubt particularly when there was a swell. This is a timely reminder that it is best practice that the bottom end of rope strops should be above the water line, to avoid any contact with the riser, but more importantly so they can be regularly inspected by the user.
