NOTICE OF RACE

ORGANISING AUTHORITY: 'FALMOUTH WORKING BOATS ASSOCIATION' IN CONJUNCTION WITH 'ST MAWES SAILING CLUB'

1. Rules

- 1.1 The Championship will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing
- 1.2 Racing rules will be changed as follows:
 - RRS A4 – Change to scoring system.
 - RRS 32.2 – Addition to the shortening course rules.
 - RRS 33 – Change to the next leg of the course.
 - RRS 35 – Change made to time limit..
 - A4 and A5 – Change to scoring system,
 - RRS 40 – Personal flotation devices.
 - Race Signals 'AP' – Signals made ashore
 - Class Rule 6(b) – Insurance cover required.These changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions.
The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.

2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 The championship is open to all 'B' and 'C' class boats of the Falmouth Working Boat Association.
- 2.2 The rating system for both classes will be TCF.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and sending it, together with the required fee, to: Helena White, by June 16th

- 2.4 All helms must be members of the Falmouth Working Boat Association.
- 2.5 Late entries will be accepted at an additional cost.
- 2.6 Cancellation: Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of races being cancelled.

3. Fees

Required fees are as follows: £45 for each boat. Late entry: £50.

4. Schedule

4.1 Dates of racing: Classes 'B' and 'C' Friday 30th June
Saturday 1st July
Sunday 2nd July

4.2 Number of races:

Friday 30th June classes 'B' and 'C' class 2 races.

Saturday 1st July classes 'B' and 'C' class 2 races.

Sunday 2nd July classes 'B' and 'C' class 1 race.

4.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is: 'B' class 10.55 'C' class 11.00.

5. Sailing Instructions

The sailing instructions will be available from the Working Boat Sailing Association on completion of the entry form and paying the required Fee.

6. Venue & Courses

All races will be sailed in Carrick Roads using Triangle-Windward- Leeward-Triangle with the finish in St. Mawes as stated in the sailing instructions, unless shortened.

7. Penalty System

"As permitted by RRS 44.1, the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty".

8. Scoring

8.1 Five races are scheduled.

8.2 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

8.3 Handicaps: Class 'B' will sail using the 2017 revised handicaps issued by the Class Association.
Class 'C' will sail as scratch, except those vessels with handicaps advised to the Committee B

10. Radio Communication

Except in an emergency a boat should neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile phones.

12. Prizes

Prizes will be given as follows: B' Class Championship Trophy.
'C' Class Championship Trophy.
Other Trophies may be awarded.

13. Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of **£3,000,000** per incident or the equivalent.

14. Risk Assessment

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone"
Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event:
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
