

ROSELAND YOUTH SAILING TRUST GUIDANCE NOTES

The Trust has been set up to offer financial support for the benefit of Juniors and Youths who couldn't otherwise afford to participate in or advance their sailing, windsurfing or other water sports. To be eligible you must reside, attend school, work or be a member of a Sailing Club on the Roseland.

Financial support could be awarded in particular, but not limited to, the following areas of relevant expenditure;

- Support for sailing courses/instructor training fees
- Running costs e.g. Quay spaces
- Competition entry fees and associated costs (including travel and accommodation)
- Kit for boats e.g. new sails/kickers
- Sail training – Hardiesse, Rona Trust, Tall Ships
- Schools, to support provision of watersports lessons as part of the curriculum or as after school clubs/activity weeks.
- Clubs, for new kit.
- Suitable clothing

Generally grants will be between £50 - £600 and available up to a maximum of 75% of expenditure.

Grants will not be awarded retrospectively for expenditure already incurred.

How do I apply?

1. Please read this guidance to ensure you are eligible for funding.
2. Fill in the application form taking care to complete it fully. You will also need to gather together any supporting information (written confirmation of any match funding and copies of any estimates or quotations you have obtained for goods or services related to the expenditure). Your parent/guardian will need to complete the financial means disclosure. All applicants financial and personal details will be kept confidential within the committee.
3. Send in the application form. Generally it will be considered at a meeting of the Trustees held twice a year (at the end of March and end of September)but applications outside this time may be considered for good reason (to be stated).
