**Captain Bligh boats race** On the afternoon of Sunday 24 June, immediately after Falmouth Classics Small Boats' Parade, StMSc will be the Organising Authority for a very unusual race. Two replicas of the boat in which Captain William Bligh undertook an astonishing 3,500 mile voyage following the Mutiny on the Bounty will race each other in the Carrick Roads. One of the boats recreated Bligh's voyage as part of a recent Channel 4 documentary and the other was built at the National Maritime Museum Cornwall for its Bligh exhibition. The race will be a combination of rowing and sailing, and the course will very much depend on the wind direction but will be predominately downwind as these boats don't point very well.
